# **Commemoration Ceremony for Amalie and Elisabeth Perls**

In 1996 the Cologne based artist Guenter Demigk launched a private initiative called "Stolpersteine" - stumbling blocks. Stones covered by a shining metal plate with names and dates engraved thus making permanently aware from which very houses Jewish citizens were deported. In the meantime Demigk has personally laid close

to 18,000 "Stolpersteine" in 330 German communities.

Considering the Jewish roots of Gestalt Therapy in Berlin, hometown of Fritz Perls and his family for a number of years (from here he in 1933 emigrated together with his wife Laura and daughter Renate to Johannesburg, later on in 1947 to New York), DVG - German Association for Gestalt Therapy - de-

cided to lay two stumbling blocks, in particular to the stones. To the sounds of music Simon J. honour the tragic destiny of Fritz Perls's mother Dress the persons present moved on to the prac-Amalie and his sister Elisabeth. "Stolpersteine" were laid in front of the house Ber-

lin-Wilmersdorf, Prinzregentenstrasse 77, in which mother and sister lived. On September 7, 1942 they were deported to Theresienstadt together with 99 other Jewish citizens. His mother died at the age of 88, his sister was murdered in Auschwitz a month later. Likewise the three brothers and the sister of Fritz Perl's mother lost their life in Theresienstadt.

Mother Amalie was born in 1858 in Silesia, today polish territory. Together with her husband Nathan she moved to Berlin in the 1880s where they lived at different places joining other family members. Fritz and Laura moved to Berlin in the 1930s. - Mother Amalie, daughter of a tailor, did not have high school education. She was more interested in arts and culture, saving money to attend opera performances together with Fritz or to visit the National art-gallery. - Fritz's sister Elisabeth was born in 1891 in Berlin as the first child. Partially sighted, she lived all her life in her mother's home. During the years of deportation she worked as an assistant secretary in the Jew-

ish Community. - Fritz's beloved sister Grete (Margarete) survived the holocaust in Shanghai, fled together with her husband in the 1950s via Israel to New York where she died in the 1970s.

To mark the laying of the "Stolpersteine", DVG jointly with the Gestalt Therapeutic Practice Berlin, Prinzregentenstrasse 85, decided to ar-

> range a small ceremony on June 27, 2008. Around 30 people met at 6:00 p.m. for the ceremony at the stumbling blocks in front of Prinzregentenstrasse 77, starting with a musical improvisation by Gestalt music therapist Simon Jakob Dress. I myself made some biographical notes to life and destiny of the two persons to pay tribute. Flowers were laid down and candles lit at each of

Two tice nearby in silence.

Walls were decorated with photographs of

mother Amalie and sister Elisabeth and those of other family members, with passages to the history of Gestalt Therapy and quotations of

Martin Buber - inviting people to get in contact with each other and to reflect about this cruel phase of history.

The choir "Bruellianten" (grown from a Gestalt music therapeutic working

group) sang three songs: a German, a South African and the American "You never walk alone" composed in 1945 by two American Jews. - After the first song Maria Deitermann and I, members of the practice, read an interview by Dan Rosenblatt with Laura Perls dating back to 1972 in which Laura spoke about the time of fascism, her escape and the fate her family suffered.

For all of us who participated it was a dignified and moving ceremony. We were happy to hear that our initiative was received with comfort by Fritz's daughter Renate and granddaughter Leslie as well as our colleagues at the New York Gestalt Institute.





# AAGT-Southwest Conference October 9-1/1,2009 Save The Date!







Philadelphia is "The City of Brotherly Love." It is located on the Delaware River in Southeastern Pennsylvania, near New Jersey. The first thing visitors discover about Philadelphia is that it's a walking town. You'll find most places are within a mile of City Hall. Stroll on pleasant, tree-lined streets that display a rich mix of architecture ranging from Colonial to Victorian to Bauhaus, sometimes all presented within the same block. Each street connects to smaller and smaller streets and alleyways that hide small groups of houses, clever gardens, footnotes to American history and good coffee spots to take a rest. Downtown Philadelphia is referred to as Center City, but within this area there are even more neighborhoods.

Society Hill is the neighborhood around Independence Hall. This is where the Liberty Bell rang out and where the Declaration of Independence, the United States Constitution, and the Bill of Rights were written and signed. Sit under a tree in the gardens. Mail postcards home from Benjamin Franklin's Post Office (besides everything else, he was the first Postmaster General). You can tour Independence National Park, then do some shopping and have a cocktail at an intimate bar; then head up the block to a play, concert, or movie; then discuss the show over a late dinner and head out again to hear live music, all within a few blocks.

We encourage those who think they might like to offer both pre-conference and conference proposals to do so, but the deadline for all proposals is the same.

**NEW BOOK: 'The Emergent Self: An Existential-Gestalt Approach'** by Peter Philippson, pub. Karnac Books/UKCP. Available from Amazon. "This book tracks a particular understanding of self as emergent from the relational field: philosophically, from research evidence and in its implications for psychotherapy. At each step, Peter Philippson includes first the theory he is working from, then the clinical implications of the theory, followed by some links to the philosophical outlook inherent in the theory, and finally a more extended case example.

The author takes the view that the continuing self is partly an illusion, partly a construct, and that we, in fact, have to work to stay the same in the face of all the different possibilities the world offers us. We do this for two reasons. First of all, continuity allows deeper contact: friendships, loving relationships with partners and families. Secondly, and balancing this, the predictable is less anxiety-producing, and we avoid this existential anxiety by acting in a stereotyped way and avoiding some of the depths of contact. This dual nature of continuing self, in one context deepening contact and in another context avoiding contact, has an important place in Peter Philippson's understanding of psychotherapy."


